Results and Effectiveness of Training:

a) 3-Day Training of Trainers for Community Resource persons-Torch Bearers and Parent Heads

The main goal of the Capacity orientation workshop was to therefore to increase awareness of Reach The Children, Uganda and Key Community Resource persons on the current priorities, status, prevention, care and treatment and the integration of Sexual and Reproductive Health (SRH) into HIV/AIDS services in our targeted Project areas. 5 sessions targeting 8 sub-counties

were done at sub-county level and we managed to train 82 community resource persons.

All efforts were done to involve district and sub-county

officials in the trainings to ensure sustainability and integration of RTC activities in already existing government structures. As a result, we have been able to register an increase in number of persons reached and improved raw data collection by the community

education are now part and parcel of our Community Resource packages in the community. Segmentation of the persons reached is now clearly reflected in our raw data. In Buvuma Island, our Torch Bearers have now been enrolled as part of Buvuma Village Health Committee Team (VHT) and are receiving cluster training in managing health related matters by Walter aid and Mild May, through Kitamiro Health Centre 4.

Other HIV/AIDS programs taught in organizations:

- a) PIASY- Government HIV/AIDS prevention education in government aided schools. All efforts are now underway for Reach The Children to shift focus to non-government schools and to children out of school. This will open up opportunities for those children that have not even one HIV/AIDS prevention program running in their communities.
- b) TB education- until recently TB has been associated greatly to HIV/AIDS. Because the country is now registering a number of TB resistant cases- TB education goes along way with HIV/AIDS education so that persons can prevent the spread of TB and refer community cases early for diagnosis and treatment.

There has been a remarkable increase in number of male and female children reached with the

Life skill education program both in school setting and this quarter we are glad to see numbers being reached out of the school setting, to include the community at large. As shown in Figure 1, a total of 5408 children, 2505 Male and 2903 Females were reached. It is interesting to note that we were able to reach 123 boys and 103 girls through the community settings – allowing those male and female children that are not in our participating schools a chance to learn this life skill education program.






